# Speakers



**Uncle Gerry Moore, OAM:** Uncle Gerry is from Wreck Bay. He is a Yuin Elder with links to the Jerrinja, Wodi Wodi, Dharawal and Wandj Wandandian Peoples. He has over 40 years' experience working in senior roles in Aboriginal Affairs. Gerry is a founding member of SWTA Inc.



**Pat Anderson, AO:** Pat is an Alyawarre woman known nationally and internationally as an advocate for the rights and health of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. She is a Co-Chair of the Uluru Dialogue, and was a key architect and signatory of the Uluru Statement from the Heart.



**Geoff Scott:** Geoff is a Wiradjuri man from Narromine in NSW with more than thirty five years of experience working in Aboriginal Affairs. Geoff is a senior leader of the Uluru Dialogue and was the Executive Officer to the Referendum Council. He was an architect and signatory of the Uluru Statement from the Heart. He is now the CEO of Just Reinvest NSW.



**Cleone Wellington:** Cleone Wellington is a Cullughutti/Jerrinja/Wandi-Wandian woman. She is the Chief Executive Leader (Culture and Connect) of Waminda, the South Coast Women's Health and Wellbeing Aboriginal Corporation.



**John-Paul Janke:** John-Paul is a Wuthathi and Meriam man. He is the National Indigenous Affairs Editor and Co-host of The Point on SBS/NITV.
